e. Annual Leave

All employees who regularly work more than 20 hours a week earn Paid Time Off (PTO). After 30 days of employment, employees shall receive PTO at the rate of .4 times their scheduled work week. After six months of employment, employees shall receive one week of paid leave, and two weeks of paid leave after one year of employment.

For example, an employee who has worked more than one year and is scheduled to work forty hours per week will receive eighty hours of paid leave, while an employee who has worked more than one year and is scheduled to work thirty hours per week will receive sixty hours of paid leave. Annual leave may be taken as sick leave, vacation, personal days, or bereavement leave and must be taken before the end of the calendar year. No employee shall be permitted to use annual leave for any period spent on unauthorized leave.

Paid leave will be calculated at a rate of 2 times the employees scheduled work week. For example, an employee scheduled to work 40 hours a week will receive 80 hours of annual paid leave. An employee scheduled 30 hours a week will receive 60 hours of annual paid leave.

After 5 years of employment the rate of paid leave will be changed to 2.5 times the employees scheduled work week. After 10 years of employment the rate of paid leave will be changed to 3 times the employees scheduled work week.

Whenever possible, a request for a leave of absence should be submitted well in advance of the time when the leave is to begin. A beginning and ending date for the leave should be indicated. Leave cannot be carried over from one year to another. Annual leave begins the first day after the last pay period in December.

Changes:

e. Annual Leave

All employees who regularly work more than 20 hours a week earn Paid Time Off (PTO). After 30 days of employment, employees shall receive PTO at the rate of .4 times their scheduled work week, until six months employment. After six months of employment, employees shall receive one week of paid leave. After one year of employment, employees shall receive two weeks of paid leave. All seasonal employees shall receive PTO at one-half the accrual rate of their scheduled work week. Seasonal employment is a type of temporary employment in which the person works during certain times of the year. Typically, nine months or less during a calendar year.

Where scheduled hours vary weekly, the previous four weeks will be averaged to determine PTO. For example, an employee that is scheduled to

work in the previous weeks twenty- five hours for two weeks and thirty hours for two weeks would result in PTO being calculated at twenty-seven and one-half hours.

For example, an employee who has worked more than one year and is scheduled to work forty hours per week will receive eighty hours of paid leave, while an employee who has worked more than one year and is scheduled to work thirty hours per week will receive sixty hours of paid leave. Annual leave may be taken as sick leave, vacation, personal days, or bereavement leave and must be taken before the end of the calendar year. No employee shall be permitted to use annual leave for any period spent on unauthorized leave.

Hello Board Members!

Summer Reading is just around the corner, the kickoff is June 2nd and this year's theme is All Together Now. The kickoff begins at 10:00 AM on June 2nd where the library will have a Balloonist, a handprint activity and a lego kit for our participants to enjoy. Throughout the months of June and July we will have 14 different activities for kids to participate in, including author visits, a juggler, a puppet show and more!

I attended the LES Site Council meeting on May 16th and the Principal brought up the idea of Punch Cards. If kids attended a certain number of library programs during the Summer then they would get a reward when they go back to school. I will be working on this with her and hopefully it encourages participation! I attended the Lions Club meeting on May 15th where the Lions generously donated \$500 to Summer Reading!

The Leavenworth county libraries are hosting the One Book, Many Neighbors program again this year. The theme is Murder Mystery & Crime, each library will host a program and have a story for patrons to read and a clue for the evidence file to see if you can unmask the killer. Our program will be on Thursday, June 29th at 6:30 PM, it will be a Murder Mystery Theater set at an Alumni dinner where one of the guests is murdered! Join in and see if you can discover who the culprit is. To attend the end of the program party, you need to attend one program event and to be eligible for the grand prize drawing, you will need to participate in 4 events. The end of the program party will be on Saturday, July 30th at 1 PM at Kane Family Farm in Tonganoxie.

The library's first Summer Concert will take place on June 2nd at 6:30 PM, the group is Blacktop Thunder who will be performing 80s Rock Music. Tail Lights will be available, a Taco Truck and Kona Ice will be on site as well. The concert will take place on Main Street.

The Friends of the Library will be hosting a Bake Sale on June 2nd during the Summer concert, more details to follow on that.

The Friends of the Library will also be hosting Bingo on June 10th from 5 PM to 8 PM at the Community Building. It is a \$10 donation per card. They will have a taco truck providing concessions. Should be a fun evening!

I have terminated Expert Cleaning on Demand, their service has been poor over the last few months. I have contacted several area cleaning companies and should have bids for your consideration for the meeting.

In discussions with Bob and Joyce, we have decided to have bills for the board meeting paid as checks to allow for quicker dispersal. E-bill pay takes 7 business days to get to its final destination, more often than not a bill could reach its destination in 2 or 3 days by mail. Joyce or myself will go to First State Bank to pay the Visa bill on the day after the board meeting to ensure continued liquidity for staff charge cards.

I looked into the possibility of discontinuing our Kanopy service, which is a video content streaming service, we do have a contract with them and we cannot discontinue the account and receive a refund while we have an active balance. This resource has received less use than Hoopla or Overdrive, since we are stuck with it, I will be meeting with a rep from Kanopy in the hopes of bolstering use of Kanopy.

It's been a busy but rewarding first month as Interim Director!

General Fund (GF) Checking account balance as of 4-28-2023 was \$337.241 99 The GF Checking account has NOT been proven to QuickBooks.

Capitol Improvement Fund (CIF) Checking account balance as of 4-28-2023 was \$151,661.61. The CIF Checking account has NOT been proven to QuickBooks.

Petty Cash was counted by Jayne on 5-23-2023. She stated the balance was \$114.30.
