Friends of Olathe Public Library Wins Outstanding Friends Group Award

The Friends of the Olathe Public Library were named Outstanding Friends Group for 2024 in recognition of their hard work, creativity, and resourcefulness.

Their nomination said: "The Friends of OPL have taken on many changes in the last five years. The Olathe Library opened the new Indian Creek Library in 2019 and included a Friends bookstore in the building. The Friends met for months setting up policies and procedures before the bookstore

opened. The library sells donated books and materials as well as some library weeded items all for \$2 or less. Sales have risen every year and

some customers come every day to see what is new. Sales in 2024 reached a record level - over \$5,000 for just one month.

"During Covid, the Friends pivoted and offered a Grab Bag of Books sale, where customers could order \$5 bags of books online, indicating their preferred genre. Customers would pull up and have the bags of books delivered to their



vehicle. The Friends made \$4,500 with this fundraiser.

"The Friends have a weekend book sale four times a year and average \$6,200 in sales at each

event. Nothing is priced over \$1 at the sales.

"Their signature fundraiser each year is the Novel Tea event. They have an author speaker, serve tea foods, and have local organizations set tables according to a theme. This year, tickets for the event to hear David Von Drehle speak about his book, *The Book of*

Charlie, sold out in ten minutes. Funds raised at this event provide scholarships for high school library volunteers.



"The Friends give materials to many local organizations, including schools, senior centers, hospitals, and other non-profit organizations. They provided a \$75,000 grant to the Olathe Library to pay for a new mobile outreach vehicle. They provide many grants each year for summer reading programs for all ages, family program days like Star Wars Day and Winterfest, bilingual baby board books for new parents, and movie licenses for the library."

David Fritzlen Friends of Winfield Public Library

David was nominated by the Friends of WPL in recognition of his outstanding work managing the group's book sales. He is also appreciated for his work with community groups and organizations, including the Winfield Veterans Home, retirement communities, and prison

outreach, all of whom benefit from the books and other materials he delivers.

His nominators say, "David has provided countless hours of expertise and energy to managing our



book sales and has built connections with community members to think of the library when they want to donate books."

Erik Bailey Friends of the Baldwin Library

Erik has served on the Board of Directors at

Baldwin City Public Library since 2021 and has volunteered as book sale coordinator since 2022.

His contribution to the library includes more than the time and physical labor he spends on the book sale. He is also acknowledged as an energetic



booster of library and community spirit. His nominators say, "Erik deserves to be recognized for this award not only for the work he does but for the outstanding person he is at heart."

Bev Sunderman Friends of the Morrill Public Library

Bev has been a creative, hard-working library volunteer for many years, serving on the MPL Board of Trustees and Friends of the Library Board, and is currently a member of the NEKLS executive board. Among other contributions, she has brought her creative



skills to fundraising projects such as the Library's Spring Tea and a popular basket raffle, and her grant-writing skills to help the library get new computers. Her nominators say, "Her passion to see our library succeed is unparalleled. Public libraries need strong

The weather was chamber-of-commerce perfect and an antique auto show on the street adjacent to the library brought in new customers as well as customers from faithful patrons and community.

Friends members managed the sale and helped with set-up and tear-down.

This year the Baldwin Friends Plant Sale made \$1,600 in sales and \$1,400 in new and renewed memberships.

The group was welcomed by Haysville Friends President, Klyda Fall, who introduced Ken Bell, Haysville Community Library Director, to provide opening remarks. Bell talked about the "interesting times" we live in and the importance of libraries remaining resilient and providing resources for their communities.

Judy Burgess, FoKL President, spoke about library advocacy. She shared how a "library snapshot" can be found online and how it can be used to highlight the library's accomplishments when advocating for it's continued support. For fun, Judy asked a few library related trivia questions and gave FoKL tote bags to the winners. She concluded her remarks inviting those present to join FoKL's *First Fridays with Friends* zoom events, read the FoKL Point Newsletter, and to stay in touch using the FoKL website. FoKL informational cards were provided at each place.
