Focus on Friends Friends of Johnson County Library

Artists of all ages are busy putting pencil (or paintbrush) to paper for the annual Friends of the Johnson County Library Bookmark Design Contest. The group is accepting submissions throughout June and July, with winners honored at an award ceremony in October during National Friends of the Library Week.



The contest has categories for artists from preschool to adult, with two winners in each age group. The prize package includes a \$20 gift card to the Friends book sale and photo files from photoshoots the Friends schedule with each winner.

Jurors for the contest include Friends of Johnson County Library staff and board, and Library staff, with submissions judged on originality, theme and creativity.

Once the winners are selected, the 2-sided bookmarks are printed and made available at

the library branches throughout the year. The winning art is on the front, and the back includes the artist's name, school (or if homeschooled, stated as such) and age, along with a quote they





provide at the time of entry about what they love most about the library. Library and Friends logos are included, plus a QR code that directs folks to the Friends website.

When we asked about the benefits the Friends group has seen from hosting this contest in the past, Shanta Dickerson, Johnson County Friends Executive Director said, "This is a beloved community event, and it raises awareness/visibility of our organization. Board members and County Commissioners alike look forward to it – it's pure joy, and it lifts spirits in a way that our appointed and elected officials deeply appreciate. Year after year, they tell us how much they look forward to this."


