Mr. Wiedmer, carried the body to the Dhone home, a distance of about a quarter of a mile. There a doctor was called and the physician upon arriving, pronounced him dead. It was the opinion of the doctor and County Cornoer E. L. Karr, that the man had been dead about two and a half hours.
