These events shape us into the people we are **destined to become**.

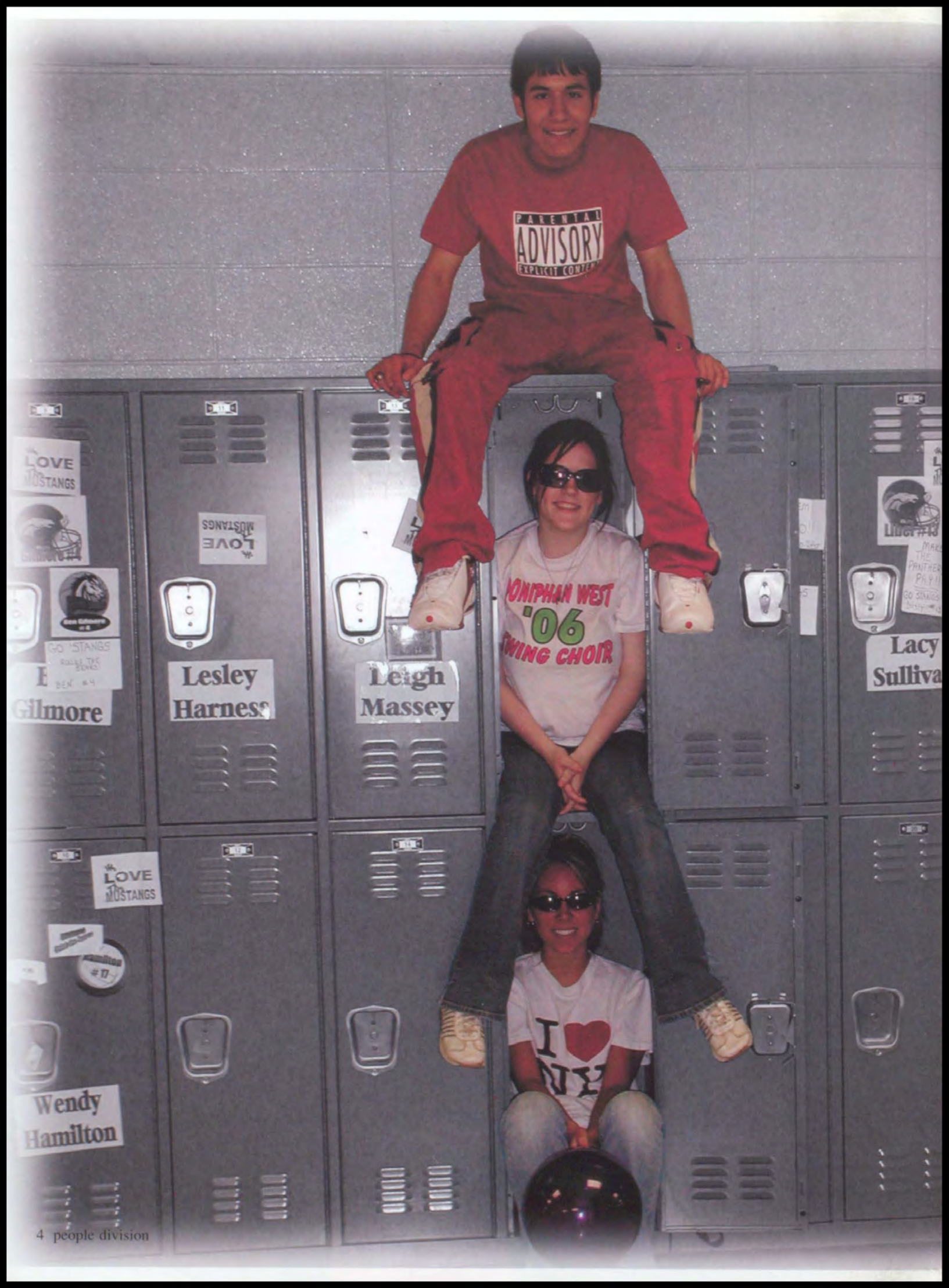

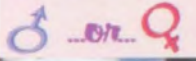

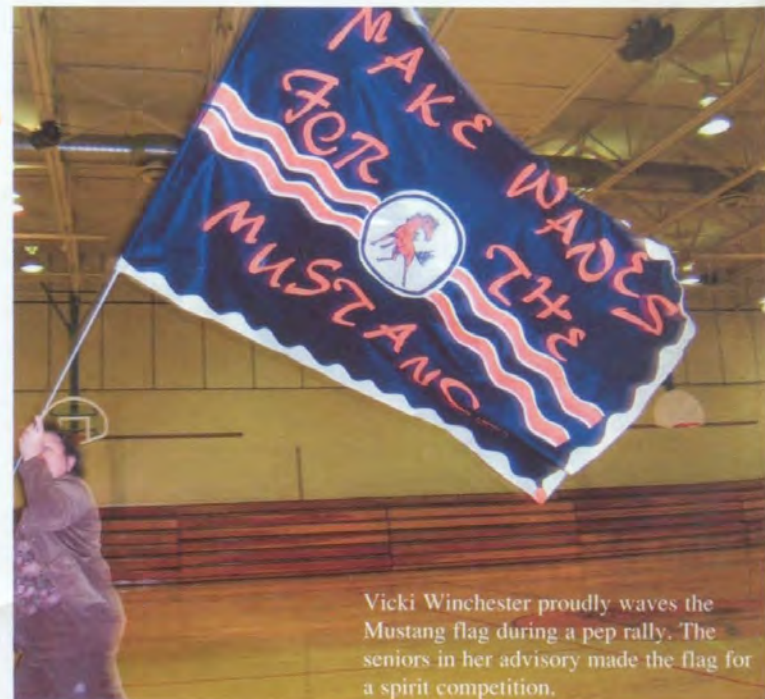

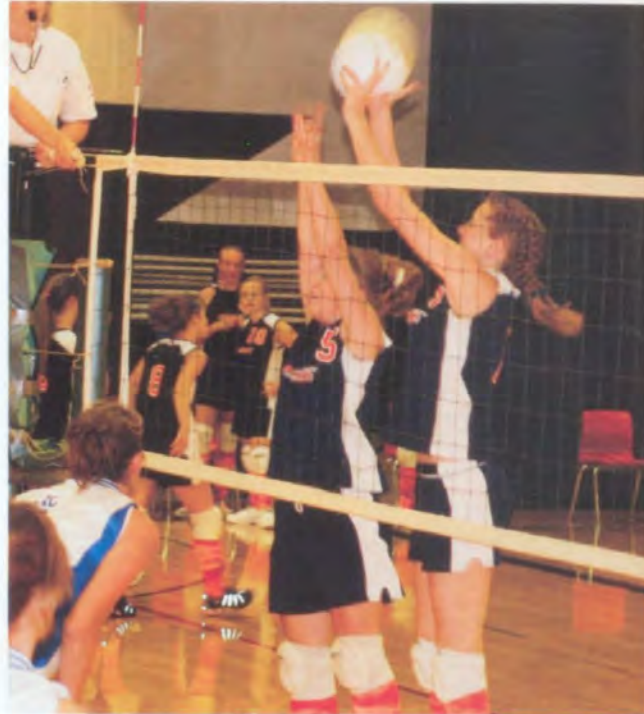

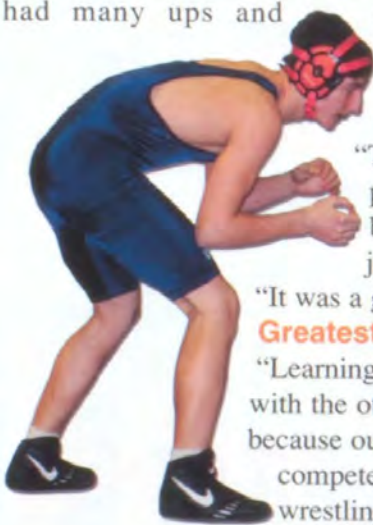

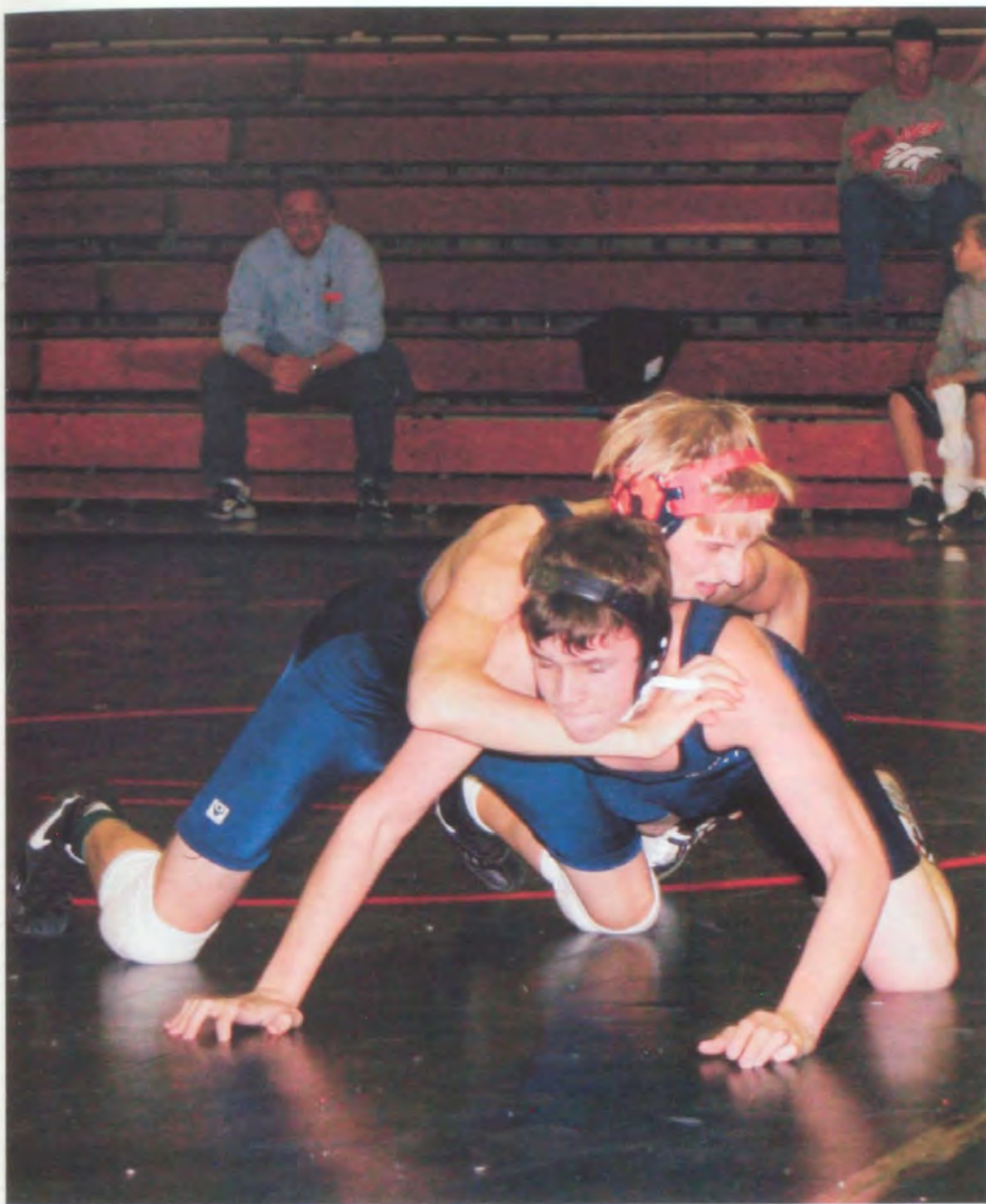

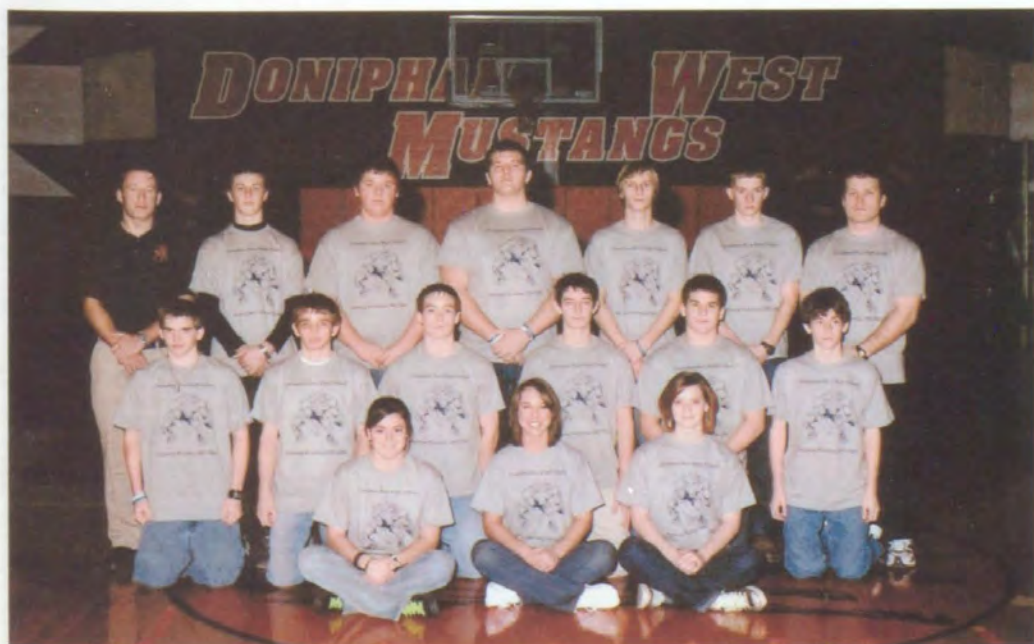

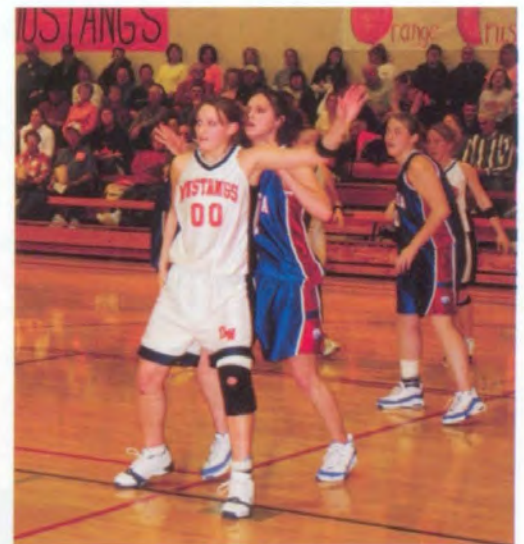


Taylor Twombly extends for a layup in the first round of sub-state against Washington.

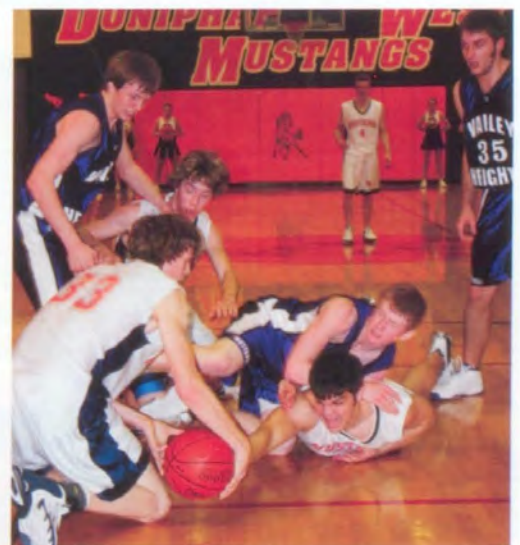


Kip Peters rises above the Troy defender to shoot a jump shot with Ben Gilmore, Eric Walsh and Kamron Winchester ready for the rebound.

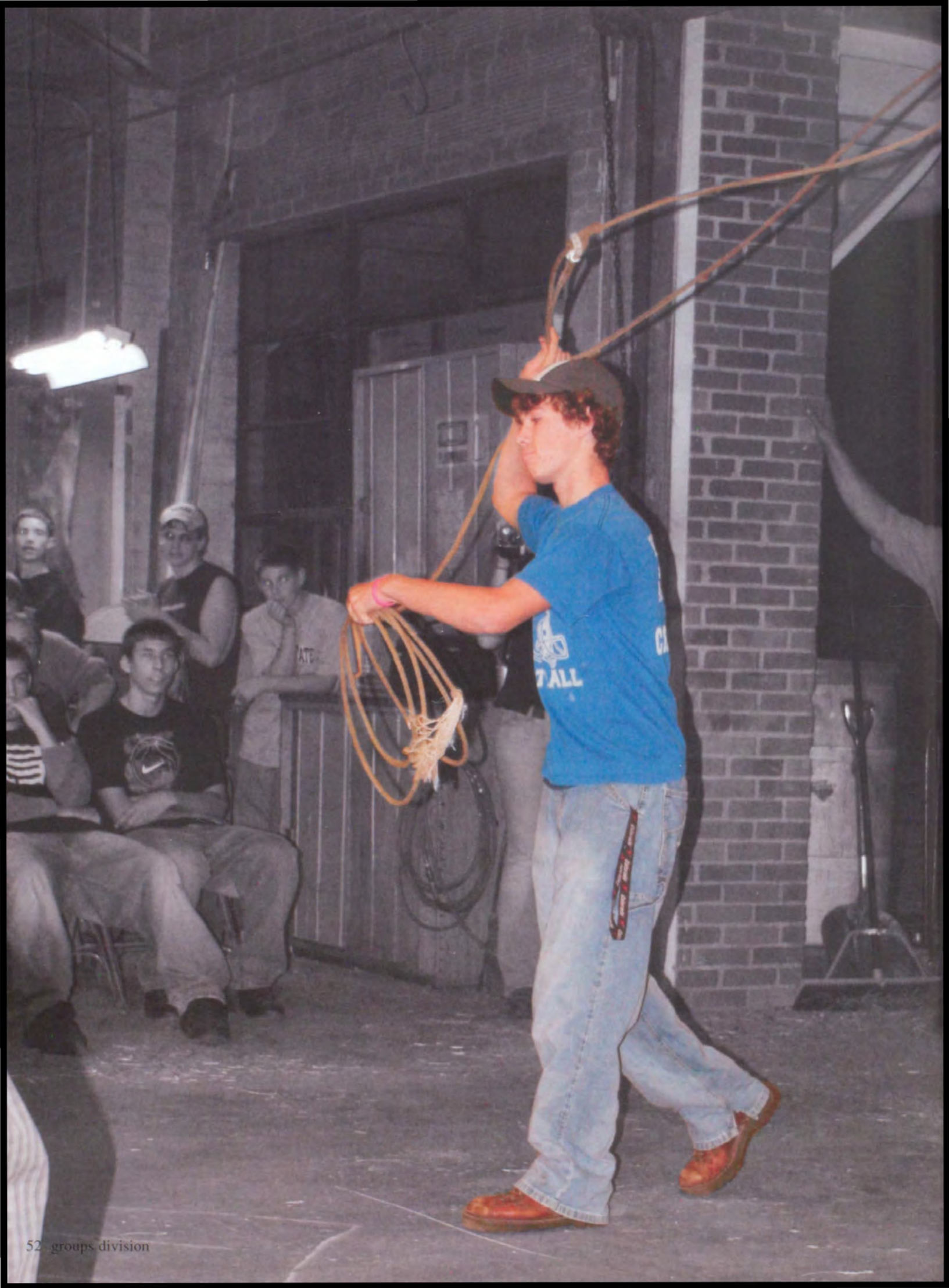

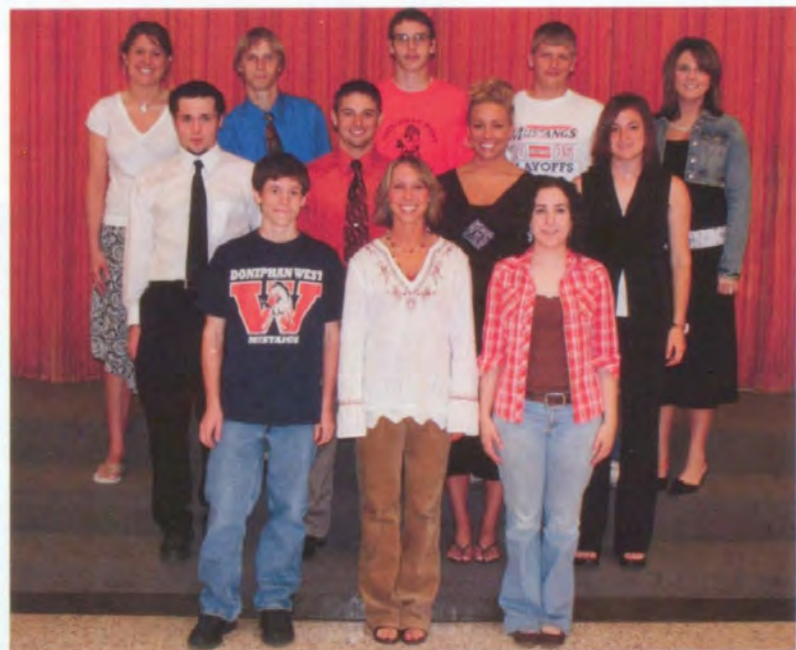

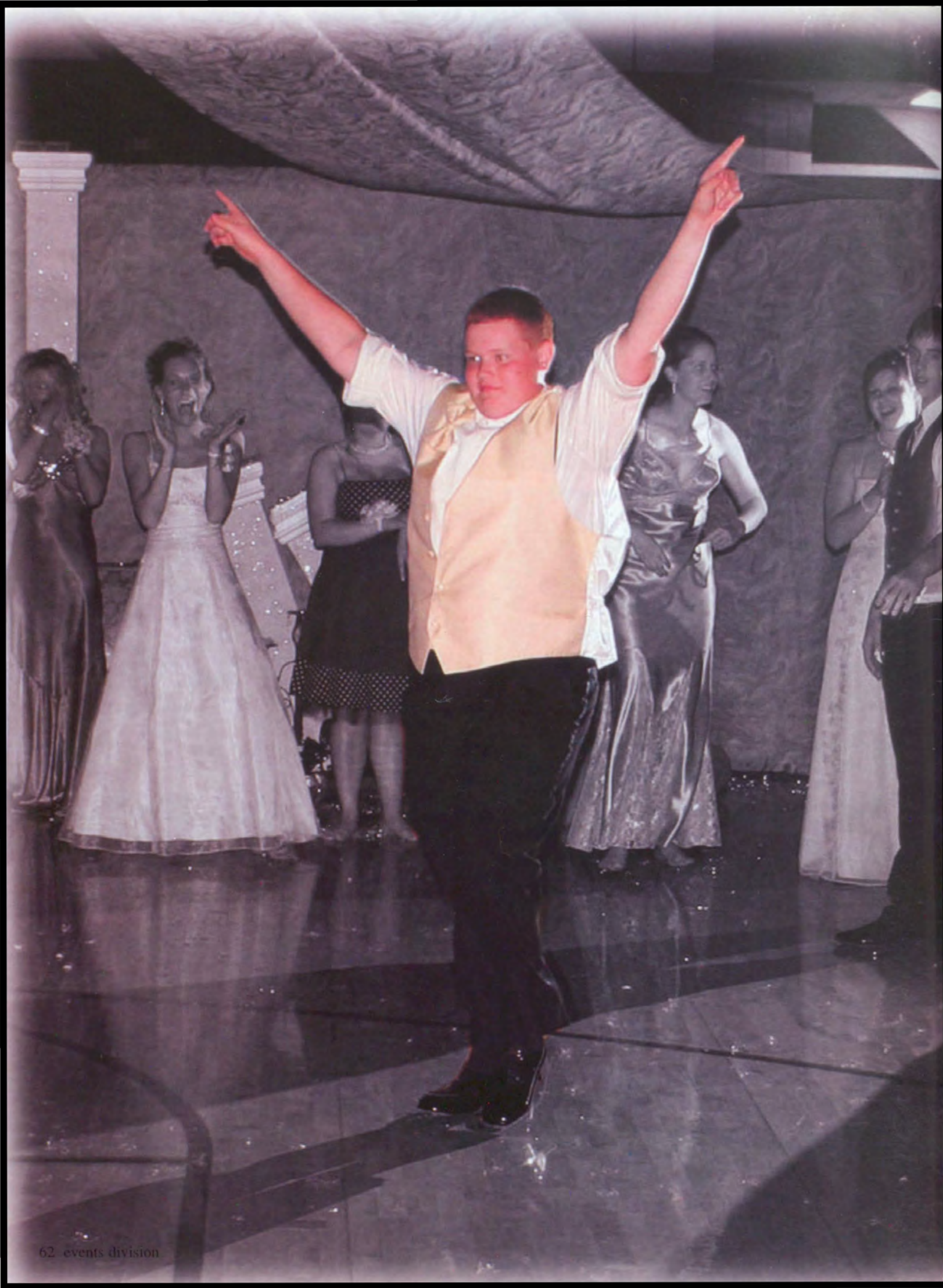
