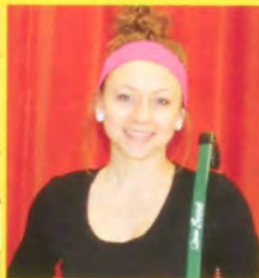

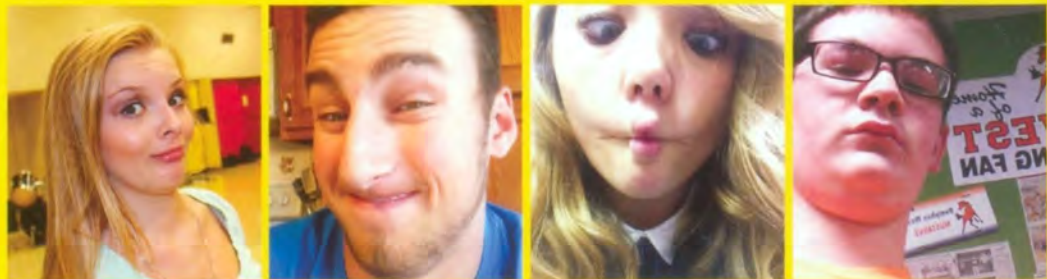
PERFECT selfie

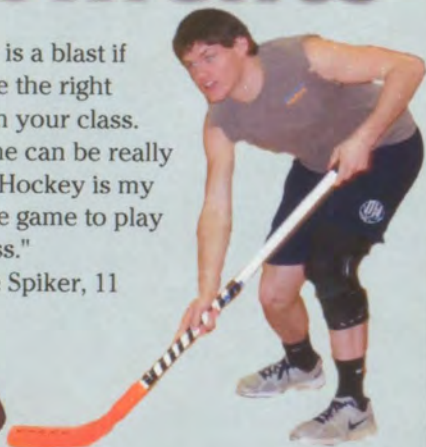

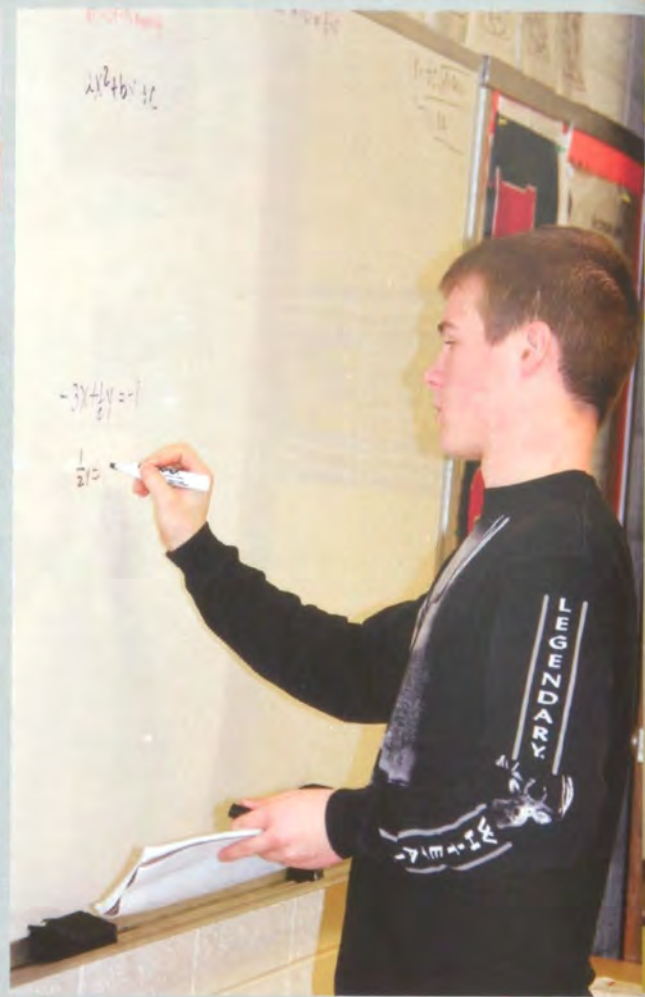

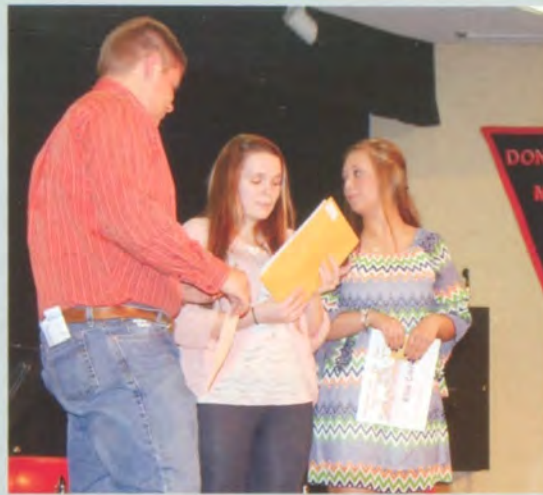

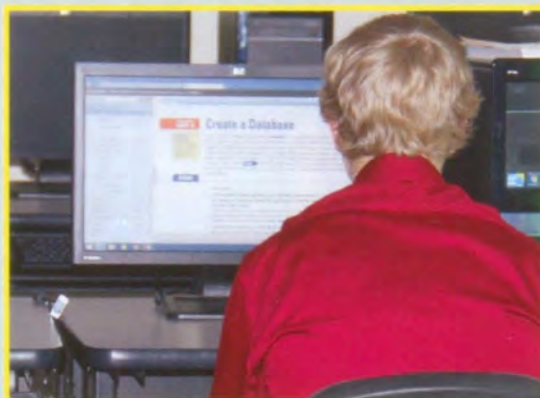

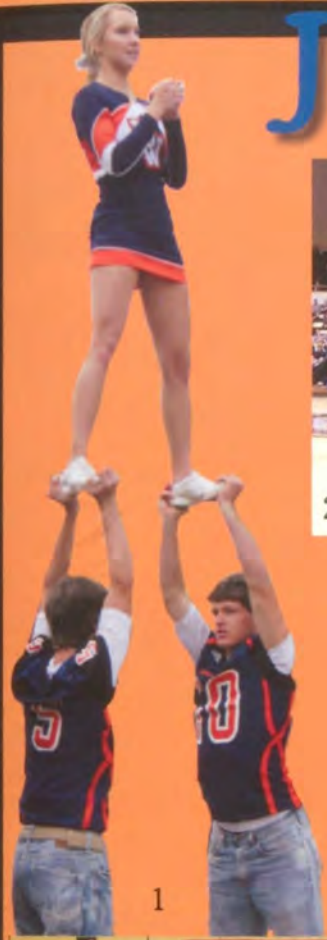

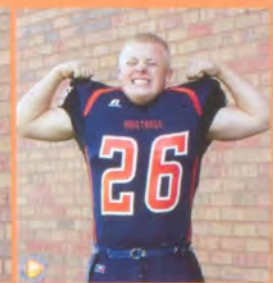
