Thursday, March 5: DWHS last day of the 3rd quarter

March 9-13: DWHS spring break

Friday, March 13: President Donald Trump declares a national emergency.

Sunday, March 15: Kansas Gov. Laura Kelly holds a press conference. USD 111 board members & admin. meet. School does not resume as scheduled.

Wednesday, March 18: Kansas schools close for the year.

Monday, March 30: Thursday, May 21 - school continues online, with most teachers utilizing ZOOM and Google Classroom to communicate with students.

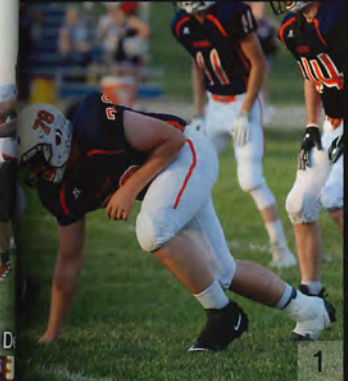

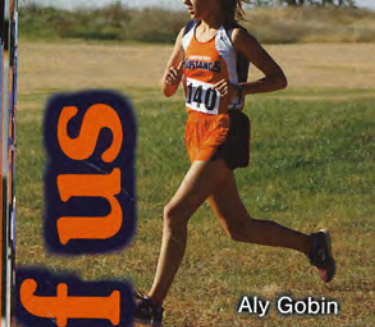

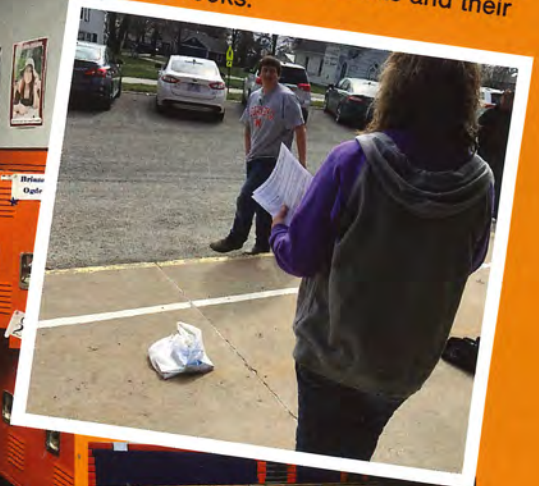

COVID-19 CORONAVIRUS OUTBREAK HEARTBREAK

The emergence of a new coronavirus strain in 2019 becomes one of the largest public health threats in recent history. The novel coronavirus causes a respiratory illness called COVID-19 that produces a cough, fever and trouble breathing. After its discovery in China in late December 2019, COVID-19 quickly spreads across the globe with 1.4M total confirmed cases as of April 7, 2020. Efforts to flatten the growth rate of COVID-19, including school closures, result in major changes to everyday life.

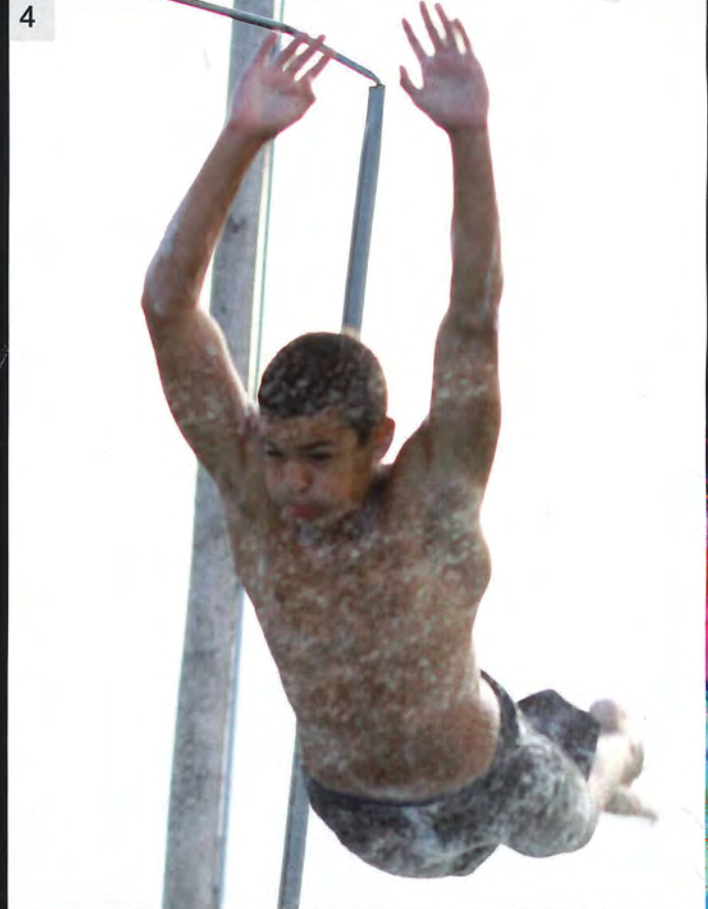

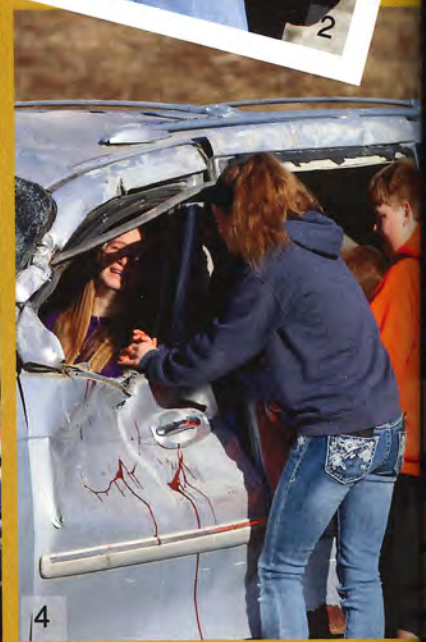
a LOOK back

Victims were cut out of the vehicles, loaded into ambulances or on life flight, and two were put into body bags. Kaitlyne narrated the scene as she presented to students from DW and some from Riverside.

WHY: Senior Kaitlyne Chadd's demonstration of knowledge for her Senior Project topic about being an EMT.

1. After life flight left the scene, students were invited to sit in the helicopter, and Kody Goff (9) takes a turn.
