While testing tubes in the amplification system used in connection with the taking of pictures at the Y. M. C. A. in Fort Leavenworth, Sergeant Charles Henry Johnson was electrocuted Sunday morning December 11. His wife was present at the time and witnessed his tragic death.

The unfortunate man had been a resident of Fort Leavenworth for ten years where he was a member of the U. S. Army. Sergeant and Mrs. Johnson resided at 1905 South Broadway and during his spare time when off of duty operated a radio repair shop at his home.

Sergeant Johnson was well known in Doniphan County having been born in Iowa Point, February 11, 1896. He was the son-in-law of R. L. and Emeline Blevins of Highland and a son of Mr. and Mrs. H. C. Johnson.

Besides his mother and wife and daughter Jeannette, he is survived by one sister Mrs. G. M. Umberger and one brother John of Harveyville, Kansas.

Sergeant Johnson was a member of the Christian Church of Highland and also a member of the Masonic Lodge in Harveyville. He was a man well liked and a good mixer with everyone.

The funeral was held from the Post Chapel at 10 o'clock Tuesday morning with Chaplain Luther D. Miller officiating and burial was in the National Cemetery, Fort Leavenworth with full military honors being accorded at the grave.
