Here is a summary of my search for information on Elmer F. Krueger.

- 1. Searched donation database for Krueger name, results were negative.
- 2. Searched donation database for Zimmerman, Remsburg, Park and Wedel (all who worked in White Cloud area), positive results for Zimmerman and Remsburg, negative for the other two.
- 3. Searched the three file folders containing information about Remsburg donation, no mention of Elmer Krueger.
- 4. Searched the two file folders containing information about Zimmerman donation, no mention of Elmer Krueger.

I am sorry, but we just have no record of Elmer Krueger being involved in excavations. Both the Remsburg and Zimmerman donations have a catalog completed by the donors and both were generous about giving credit to others, so perhaps the artifacts in question were sent elsewhere. There is just not enough information to tell for sure.

Her father was Elmer F. Krueger, a teacher in White Cloud, KS, during the late 1920s and early 1930s. He knew Chief White Cloud and collected Indian artifacts. He was involved in some excavations there, but Karen was not familiar with the names George Remsburg, Mark Zimmerman, Edward Park, or Waldo Wedel. Apparently he told his daughter that artifacts from the project once were exhibited in the Memorial Building with a label mentioning his name as assisting with the recovery. She would like to see this material.

Krueger also had a human skull and complete pottery vessel that came from a burial. About 1990 he turned over the skull to a friend who worked for the NPS. Karen wants to bring in the pot for identification. It is now in Washington, DC. I told her to alert us a few days before she came.
