William L. Anderson was born in Doniphan County near Wathena, April 9, 1860, and died at his home in Horton, March 4, 1943.

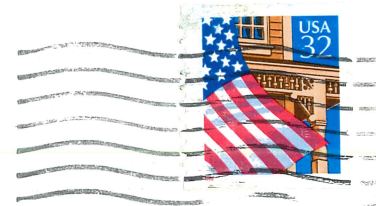
He was a lifelong resident of his native state and spent the last 11 years of his life in Horton.

Nannie A. Deckard and William L. Anderson were united in marriage February 28, 1894. This fine couple observed their 59th wedding anniversary February 28 of this year. They were the parents of nine children of whom seven are living.
