Now came the time to initiate the unlucky Freshmen. Boy! What a job we did, but we gave them a party in the evening, hoping they would forgive us. That eventful day, "graduation", is coming closer by the hour and I know the other Seniors are looking ahead to that day with moistened eyes, too. We have gotten our pictures taken and

are waiting to see them up with the other graduates of S. H. S.

There has been only one person in the class of '50 that has completed all his public school education in the Severance schools. Twelve years in one school building is a rather unusual event. Thus another class is soon going out into the world to earn the bread, and I hope they all make good and remember the good days spent in SEVERANCE HIGH SCHOOL.

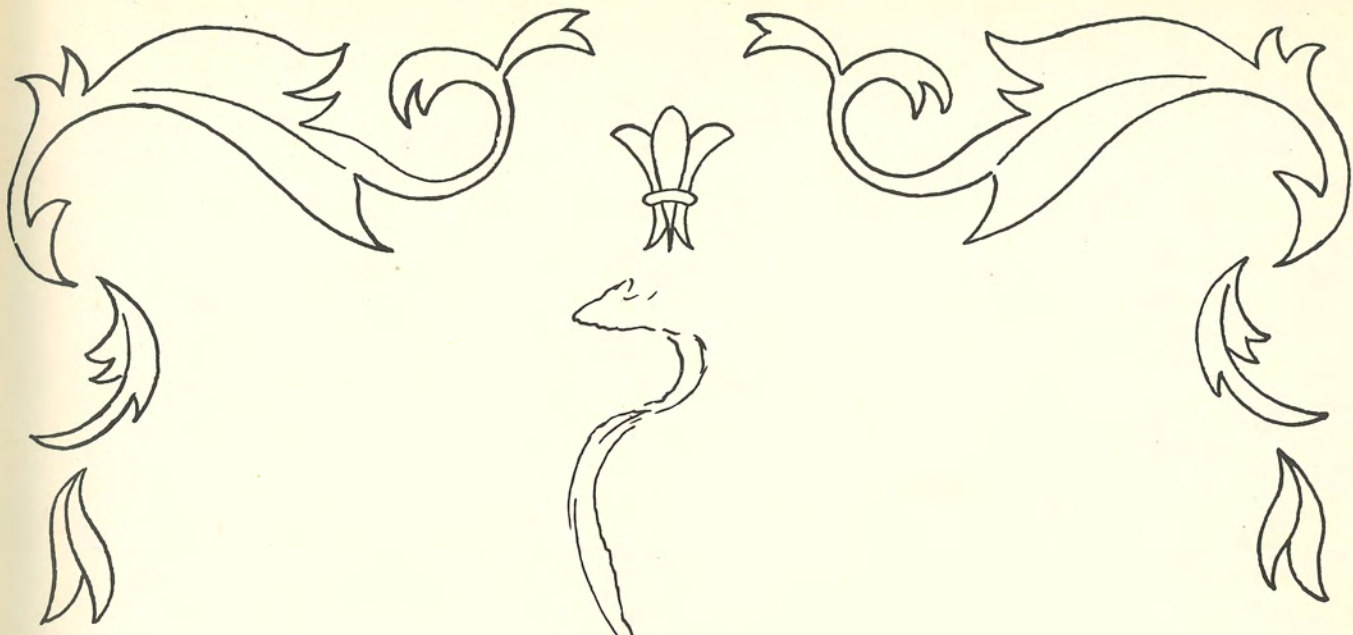
Helen dismissed the class early when she saw me. She said I hadn't changed a bit but from the looks of things she had, for the better.
